In reviewing the financial statements through February:

We are 67% into our budget and the expenses are on track over-all at 68%.

With regard to revenue, the City has not transferred any funds from the general fund.

The total is \$45,000. I'll check with the finance office to see when that will be happening. Other than that the revenue is on track as well.

On May 11th, we will have our Mother's Day event with flower vendors setting up on the mall. The headlining band that evening will be Driftwood.

On June 29th there will be a big fundraising event at the Gilchrist Gallery for Discover Downtown Cumberland. Everyone keep this date on your calendars! There will be music provided by Bowman, Bowman and Dre. More to come as this event is in the planning stages.

Executive Directors Report

- -Our 5 interns from Allegany College have been working incredibly hard. They will be decorating the stage tomorrow/early Saturday morning for St. Patricks Day and the Hooley Pub Crawl. The students are also working on a fundraiser on May 11th for the Discover Downtown Cumberland event series. They have a lot of great ideas including a silent auction. The event will be held at the Culinaire Café.
- -Attended the Canal Town Partnership Meeting yesterday. The Canal Town Partnership is a regional economic and community development program along the C&O Canal. It is designed to assist the communities along the C&O to reap multiple benefits of trail-based tourism and recreation. They are very happy to have a representative from Cumberland. The current project this group is working on is updating the ‰wpath to Town+brochure which distributes 20,000 brochures throughout the state of Maryland.
- -The Trail Guide updates have been submitted to Doug Riegner. The Trail Guide is distributed every year at visitor centers and stops along the Great Allegheny Passage. The Cumberland edits included additions to our businesses, a few deletions, and an updated calendar of events.
- -Everything is set for the Hooley Pub Crawl this weekend. Dave Love, David Rorobaugh, and I have been pushing the individual events on Facebook and the official schedule has been released. The DDC is contributing with a performance on the McCoury Family Stage by Day Old News from 2pm-5pm.
- -The DDC received a \$5,000 Canal Heritage Area Mini Grant for our event in August, Weinerfest part two. Last year was Coney Islands 100 year anniversary so we focused on Coney Island. This year will focus on the entire Downtown Cumberland area and highlight numerous businesses.
- -Danny and Corey are working on getting the Downtown area ready for the Spring. The picnic tables have been put out and the Christmas lights are coming down. We also have the tables and chairs back at the stage area for all of our outdoor events coming up.
- -Lavale WalMart recently released a Cumberland Monopoly game. Numerous games were purchased for us to have set up at our Downtown events and one person recommended having a Cumberland Monopoly tournament during one of our warmer weather events, possibly Heritage Days. The game focuses on the positives of Cumberland and highlights numerous businesses and attractions in our area.
